



DreamCatchers was established in 1993 by a group of women who wanted to participate in community philanthropies, but had professional or family responsibilities that limited their ability to fully serve their chapter, Assistance League of Huntington Beach.

For their first fundraiser held in 1994, DreamCatchers sold homemade birdhouses outside a member's yogurt shop. Members raised \$1,000.00, which they used to purchase a copier for the Huntington Beach Youth Shelter. DreamCatchers soon expanded their fundraisers to include a yearly "Season of Dreams" event for which members assembled fantastic gift baskets for silent auction. Today, DreamCatchers' baskets are available for bid at the annual Treasures by the Sea® fundraiser held by Assistance League Huntington Beach each Spring.

Since its beginning, the auxiliary has been proud to work cooperatively with chapter members in Assistance League Huntington Beach's Thrift Store, the annual Treasures by the Sea fundraiser, Operation School Bell®, and Operation New Beginnings Veteran's Scholarship program. In addition, DreamCatchers have expanded their philanthropic efforts to include support for senior citizens (Support Our Seniors), the Huntington Beach Therapeutic Riding Center, Huntington Beach Hospital's psychiatric outpatient program (Silver Anchor), and the Alzheimer's Family Center. Last year, DreamCatchers raised over \$63,000.00 for its philanthropies This included a \$1000.00 grant they received from National Assistance League, which DreamCatchers then awarded to Huntington Beach Council on Aging. The money was used to purchase and install safety grab bars in the home bathrooms of seniors at-risk for falls.

Five founding members, Linda Eide, Judy Francis, Ann Harvey, Martha Nishida and Frauke Tsuneyoshi are still active in DreamCatchers. They were recently honored in June at the auxiliary's Installation Dinner. Not only have they served as chairmen and Board members, these women have assembled hundreds of gift baskets for the annual fundraiser and have sorted thousands of bags of donations. Their combined 125 years of volunteering represent countless hours of service to the people of our community.

DreamCatchers meet the second Wednesday evening of each month at the Assistance League building at 8071 Slater Avenue. The volunteer and work activities are largely weekend or evening events. Bolsa Chica, A Unique Outdoor Classroom That Inspires

As summer draws to a close and the beaches begin to empty, children return to school for another year of their educational career. Students tackle new concepts while adding depth to the topics learned in previous years, all within the confines of their school. With the help of lessons, text books, and independent research, students can obtain a solid grasp of what they are taught as the year progresses. However, there is only so much that can be gained in the four walls of a classroom. Students understand what they are learning, but are they able to say they have experienced it?

The Bolsa Chica Conservancy offers an extra dimension to teaching science that gives students that personal experience that would otherwise be missed in a simple classroom setting. Through hands-on, STEM-based educational programs, the Bolsa Chica Conservancy offers engaging outdoor education opportunities to students of all ages and comprehension levels. From guided hikes through the Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve to bringing the Bolsa Chica wetlands to schools through the Windows to Our Wetlands (WOW) program, students are able to acquire first-hand knowledge when discovering the science concepts being taught by their teacher.

With over 1,400 acres, Bolsa Chica is one of Orange County's largest outdoor classrooms, with miles of trails to explore and hundreds of plant and animal species to discover. Visiting students are guided through the wetlands by trained, volunteer naturalists with a keen eye for the local wildlife and history.

The Bolsa Chica Conservancy also offers multiple hands-on science labs that

further reinforce what's being taught in the classroom and on the trails. From discovering the biodiversity hiding in the mud to studying variations in water quality samples, students are able to participate in scientific data collection on par with formal field research data collection. This hands-on lab experience connects what they learn in the classroom and on the trails, strengthening their understandings of wetland ecology.

Students are also able to enhance their wetland experience with other activities, such as a birding and adaptations based field activity as well as STEAM-based crafts that allow students to take what they've learned and add their own creative spin to it. Crafts like Create a Critter teaches students about adaptations before having the students create their own clay animal species based off of the adaptations discussed before the craft. Their imagination is the only limit!

And for those students unable to make it to the Bolsa Chica wetlands, the WOW program is ready to supply them with their own Bolsa Chica experience. This travelling science program has journeyed near and far to reach students in their schools, after-school programs, and extracurricular activities, driving to cities like San Pedro, Canoga Park, and Riverside to reach communities across southern California. Thanks to donors like the EGBAR Foundation and the Anglers of Huntington Harbour.

The knowledge gained by having a hands-on, outdoor learning experience cannot be matched in a classroom setting. While the classroom is a great place to learn about crucial concepts, the wetlands is a place to gain that first-person experience that makes the lessons a meaningful experience that is unique to each student. With experience comes attachment, and with attachment comes the desire to protect the natural resources the Bolsa Chica Conservancy seeks to preserve.

- We get used to possessions
- Our expectations tend to increase
- We start to compare our possessions with others.

contrast, the Power of Experiences deliver much more lasting happiness according to www.successresources.com, for the following reasons:

- Experiences are a part of our identity
- Comparisons don't really matter
- Anticipation matters
- Experiences last a short time, but the value tends to increase as time passes.
- Buyer's remorse is fleeting with an experience, but stays with you when you have that thing!

My favorite is the Anticipation factor. When we plan a vacation, I really enjoy researching a new place: historical points of interest, wines produced in the region, best restaurants (not the priciest!!), and why others go there.

Do I bring my hiking boots or just some good walking shoes? Am I

reviewing the maps of Crow Pass Trail in Alaska or mapping visits to many museums in Washington, DC? And those are so different from visiting Paris which is different than Bordeaux, but they are both in France. All these engaging experiences are so much fun to plan.



For many, football soirees offer a oneday food pass. Fat-laden dishes that might usually be forbidden are almost a rite of passage at gatherings focused on football.

Nachos seem a quintessential snack. The cheese, the chips, the salsa combine to offer a marriage of flavor and texture that make an irresistible treat. I'm not referring to the oh-so-scary style sold at most ballparks and movie theaters. The ones topped with that bizarre orange goop.

I mean the classic Tex-Mex munchie that's made with 100 percent real cheese. The kind that several Texas-Mexico border-town cafes claim to have invented during World War II.

If you like, start with a homemade One-Minute Salsa from America's Test Kitchen. In a food processor combine 1/2 jalapeno (seeded if you prefer it less spicy, minced), 1/4 small red onion, 1 small garlic clove (peeled, minced), small handful fresh cilantro leaves, salt and pepper to taste, 2 teaspoons fresh lime juice. Pulse until minced (about five



1-second pulses, scraping down sides as necessary). Stir in 1 (14-ounce) can diced tomatoes (drained). Easy.

Adjust oven rack to middle position; preheat oven to 400 degrees. Spread 4 ounces tortilla chips (I prefer thick ones) on a 9-by-13-inch rimmed baking sheet (or large ovenproof platter). Top with about 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese. If you like spicy versions, add 1/2 to 1 large jalapeno (thinly sliced). Or if you prefer,

use sliced pickled jalapenos. Top with 4 more ounces of tortilla chips and 2 cups of shredded cheese. Bake 7 to 10 minutes or until cheese is melted. Cool about 3 minutes. Sprinkle on some thinly sliced green onion. Along the edges drop scoops of your favorite guacamole, sour cream and salsa.



A biennial event, Surfboards On Parade's inaugural year was in 2014, and was part of the City's 100 years of surfing



Susan Butala, President of the Orange County Fuschia Society, enlightened those members in attendance at the May meeting, held at the lovely home of Lara Anderson, about the doable task of having fuschias in the garden. Fuschias tend to have the reputation of being a difficult plant to grow successfully. The key to success is the right amount of water and sunshine, says Susan. Regular attention to keeping the soil moist, but not too wet is important as most varieties are drought tolerant. They have moderate light requirements meaning half shade or indoors in a west facing window. During the blooming period of May through September, fertilize regularly. Since most fuschias are bush like, they can become leggy if not pruned or pinched back to a desired shape during their growing period. The delicate, dangling flowers make the plant ideal for hanging baskets. In June, the O.C. Fuschia Society has an annual plant sale of several varieties of this eye catching, richly combo-colored (usually in red, purple, pink, and white) blooming plant. Several of us bravely took a plant home to nurture. My Midnight Sun variety is still alive and blooming! Climatologists who are not funded by conservation groups seem to settle on the possibility the seas will rise about 0.003 feet per year. This works out to less than 4 inches in 100 years. There are many reasons, most having to do with climate change. The earth has experienced climate change for millions of years and there seems to be a very small temperature increase for the past ten years. The only real argument whether this is manmade or not. The consensus between independent climatologists is that less than 1% is caused by us humans. Some say sea level rise (SLR) is caused by our warming planet. There is also a question as to what would be the best average temperature for our planet, higher, lower, or the same. Finally measuring SLR is extremely difficult. It has been only in the past decade that the sea level could be measured, aided by more accurate GPS information. This is why it is actually difficult to know exactly how high our seas were even 20 or 50 years ago. As a matter of fact I have been measuring the high water mark on my seawall for the past 35 years and noticed it has actually lowered by as much as an inch. There are many reasons for this such as dredging and natural under water earth movement, Long Beach pumping, etc.

The bottom line is that while we have a few King Tides every year that flood our streets there is actually no concrete evidence that even if our harbor is rising 0.003"/year it would take hundreds of years before it would affect us. In my next column I'll expand a bit more on this and in the mean time please feel free to contact me or write a letter to the editor of Harbour Light, a great community publication. 
WHO WE ARE
