Girl Scouts in Huntington Harbour

Junior Troop 6235 in San Francisco for the "Bridging Ceremony." 7,000 Girl Scouts from around the USA crossed the Golden Gate Bridge to symbolize their transition from Junior Girl Scout to Cadette Girl Scout.

On April 5th, Brownie Troop 5220 and Junior Troop 6235 hosted a Ponytail Roundup at Harbour View Elementary School. The Ponytail Roundup is an annual event where students, staff and parents at Harbour View donate their hair to make free wigs for children with hair loss. Troop 223 started a Locks of Love event at the school 17 years ago, which has evolved and been passed down to several troops to keep the event going. This year we had over 28 participants who donated at least 8 inches of their own hair for this great cause. All participants received a special t-shirt and a free haircut done by stylists from The Paul Mitchell School in front of the entire school. The event was organized and paid for by the 30 girls from troops 5220 and 6235 with the proceeds they earned from selling Girl Scout Cookies and Fall Product. The cost of this event was over \$600. What a great way to give back.

Junior Troop 6235 just flew back from an exciting trip to San Francisco! They were part of a large bridging ceremony with 7,000 other Girl Scouts from around the USA. The girls and their chaperones walked the entire Golden Gate Bridge to symbolize the completion of two years as a Junior Girl Scout to become a Cadette Girl Scout. After crossing the bridge there was a big celebration in Crissy Field with food, music & fun! They also enjoyed touring the city of SF visiting The Japanese Tea Garden, California Academy of Sciences Museum, Chinatown, Union Square and they even rode in a cable car. The girls planned this adventure themselves and 85% of it was paid for with the money they earned from selling Girl Scout Cookies and Fall Product. It took two years of planning and saving to make this trip possible. This is a memory they will cherish forever.

HHPC: Boat Parade

Join the biggest party of the year and get ready to rock! The 2019 Huntington Harbour Boat Parade and home decorating theme is “Rock & Roll Fantasy.” Any era of rock and roll qualifies, let your creativity run wild! You can rock out with a band, do a celebrity rock star theme or impersonation, recreate an iconic moment in rock and roll history, and perhaps even reuse some of your decorations from other years that might be applicable.

Just one caveat, I have been told in no uncertain terms we need to keep it all very “family friendly.” Please don’t toss a bunch of empty Jack Daniels bottles on your lawn and set a couch on fire while you dance around it wearing one-piece reindeer pajamas lip syncing to “Shout at the Devil”...(if you know what I’m talking about, I’m talking to you.)

Grand Marshal Larry Gottlieb is already lining up boats for a spectacular parade December 14 and 15. As of the print deadline, these fine folks have committed boats to participate in addition to Larry; Jim Childers, Dean Oliver, the Seagate Yacht Club, William Larkin, and

George and Sylvia DiMatteo.

We do need to clarify, especially with newcomers to the Harbour, (because it is a bit confusing,) the boat parade is NOT the Cruise of Lights® or vice-versa. They are two separate events. The Cruise of Lights® takes people out on boats to look at decorated homes. The boat parade is people watching decorated boats from homes (or other boats, or the beaches.)

The 2019 Huntington Harbour Boat Parade and home decorating theme is “Rock & Roll Fantasy”

One is a fundraiser (the Cruise), the other (the Parade) is the Huntington Harbour Philharmonic Committee’s way

of saying “thank you” to the Harbour residents for decorating their homes so we are able to have a fundraiser called the Cruise of Lights® (because a “Cruise of Dark Homes” won’t sell many tickets!)

That’s why it is so important to decorate and participate—it’s much more than looking festive for the holiday season. The Cruise of Lights® generates a vital and substantial amount of revenue for the Philharmonic Society of Orange County’s youth music programs by selling thousands of tickets for the public to board large, professionally captained boats contracted for the event.

The boat parade is an all-volunteer effort of private boats organized by the HHPC. It is not a function of the city, a marina company, or chamber of commerce, (like other communities’ boat parades.) The boat parade is intended to be the HHPC’s show of appreciation to the waterfront and off-water Harbour residents for supporting our efforts to raise money for youth music programs through the Cruise of Lights® fundraiser, and have some fun doing it!

Cathy Thomas Cooks

Many of you know and love Chef Pascal Olhats. In his many years in O.C., his charm and culinary talent have garnered many fans and friends. Pascal is fighting T-cell lymphoma but remains very optimistic about recovery.

At some point, cancer invades the life of someone we know and love. Like most people, I want to help friends and family that are undergoing treatment. I want to cook something irresistible, but I am at a loss as to what would be nourishing and appealing. The cookbook “The Cancer-Fighting Kitchen” by Rebecca Katz with Mat Edelson cuts through all the confusing data and offers tangible ways to be helpful. Here’s a recipe from the book. Pascal said that the soup is delicious.

Chicken Vegetable Soup with Ginger Meatballs, 4 servings

Meatballs:

1 pound ground turkey or chicken, 2 teaspoons grated fresh ginger, 1 teaspoon minced garlic, 1/4 cup fresh parsley (finely chopped), 1/2 teaspoon sea salt, pinch of cayenne, 1 egg, beaten, 1/3 cup uncooked white basmati or jasmine rice.

Soup:

2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, 1 yellow onion, diced small, sea salt, 1 large carrot (peeled, diced small), 1 large celery stalk (diced small), 2 cloves garlic (minced), 1 teaspoon grated fresh ginger, 8 cups store-bought organic chicken broth, 1/2 cup fresh or frozen sweet peas, 1/4 cup fresh parsley (finely chopped), 1/4 cup fresh basil (finely chopped), garnish: 1 lime, cut into quarters.

1. For meatballs: Line rimmed baking sheet with wax paper. Combine turkey, ginger, garlic, parsley, salt, cayenne, egg and rice in bowl and mix with your hands or a spatula until well combined. Wet palms of hands and roll into 1-inch balls and place on prepared pan.

2. For soup: Heat oil in soup pot over medium heat; add onion and pinch of salt and cook until translucent about 4 minutes. Add carrots, celery, garlic, ginger and 1/4 teaspoon salt; continue cooking for about 3 minutes.

3. Pour in 1/2 cup broth to deglaze pot and cook until liquid is reduced by half. Add remaining 7 1/2 cups broth and another 1/4 teaspoon salt; bring to boil on high heat. Reduce heat to maintain a vigorous simmer, then gently transfer half of the meatballs into the simmering broth (refrigerate or freeze the remainder to use later). Cover and allow the meatballs to simmer for 15 minutes. Add peas and cook 3 minutes more, then stir in parsley and basil. Serve each bowl garnished with a wedge of lime.

Summer Fun at Bolsa Chica

As summer gets into full swing and the beaches begin to attract people from near and far, children look forward to the promise of fun in the sun and close another year of their educational career. While summer allows children to put away their books and daily homework, it doesn't mean to say they can't participate in engaging programs that continue to stimulate their learning and interest in the outdoors. In fact, studies have shown that children who are involved in summer programs help them build interest and skills to become successful adults.

The Bolsa Chica Conservancy provides an extra dimension to fun activities in the summer time. It offers two youth programs that offer learning in a fun, hands-on environment that allows children to learn wetland science without the pressure of homework and tests. The BCC's Summer Youth Programs include the Summer Wetland Explorers Program (SWEP) and the Youth Leadership in Environmental Actions Program (YLEAP).

The Summer Wetland Explorers Program (SWEP) allows children, grades K-7, to explore the wetlands at the Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve and Bolsa Chica State Beach during week-long programs of outdoor learning. For one week, from 9:00am to 4:00pm, children find themselves in immersive outdoor activities, science-based labs and crafts, and exploration that stimulate wonder and critical thinking.

The first week of 2019's SWEP begins June 24th and is for Junior Summer Wetland Explorers, grades K through 3. The second week begins July 8th and is for Senior Summer Wetland Explorers, grades 4 through 7. Children learn about habitats, wetlands, watersheds, ecosystems, food webs, and conservation through guided hikes through nearly 5 miles of trails, hands-on science labs, and STEM-based activities and crafts.

YLEAP begins July 29th, and is designed for middle school and high school students to be engaged and mentored as conservation leaders. Much like their younger counterparts in the Explorers Program, they are immersed in a one-week, all-day, outdoor training program that exposes them to wetland science, conservation, restoration, and leadership skills. Following their summer experience, YLEAP participants are required to volunteer at the Reserve for a minimum of 30 hours over 11 months. Participants return to help lead tours, conduct habitat restoration, and assist in outreach and citizen science projects.

The Conservancy's Summer Youth Programs are at the intersection of nature and education, conservation of land and wildlife, and ensuring clean water systems. The program offers children and youth the opportunity to spend a week of the summer outdoors exploring the 1,445 acre Reserve and learning about the importance of wetlands and the species of plants and animals dependent upon the wetlands to thrive.

The Reserve's coastal wetland serves as habitat for more than 200 species of birds and hundreds of plant and other animal species. In the United States, 35% of all plants and animals listed as threatened

or endangered either live in the wetlands or are reliant upon them. The Summer Program participants learn the value of wetlands, the land-sea interface, and their own personal role in ensuring the protection and preservation of this natural resource. They learn how human activities can have negative effects on the natural environment and immersion in the wetlands promotes a deep and lasting appreciation for this precious resource.

Finally, children are given the opportunity to unplug and appreciate nature through exploration of the Reserve and nearby Bolsa Chica State Beach. The required volunteer component of YLEAP assures that middle and high school participants will devote more hours to being immersed in nature, and our hope is that all participants will leave these programs with leadership skills and a desire to spend more time exploring the outdoors, choosing nature over screen-time and electronic devices.

Got 5 minutes? Stretch

We always wish we had more time to take care of ourselves, especially when things start aching and creaking. Over time our connective tissues gradually lose extensibility and thus flexibility. This is especially true for any age when single positions like sitting at a desk or in a car, consume most of a day. Stretching is probably one of the most important things we can do for our bodies that we definitely have control over. As a Physical Therapist, I see so many injuries and pain issues that are caused or perpetuated by inflexibility. Of course, I would be happy to help you with an assessment and a personalized program, but there is so much you can do throughout your day to fit stretching in and make it routine.

First, a few basic principles of stretching are essential. Stretching should not be painful or forced. Stretches need to be held for at least 30 seconds, up to a full minute to be effective and not result in a protective shortening response. Probably



most important, stretching of muscle groups needs to be consistent in order to make long term changes in connective tissue flexibility and length, 3 times a week is not enough.

Here are a few things you can add in while you are doing other more routine life activities. When you are going up or down steps, pause and drop your heels over the edge to stretch your heel cords. Try this with both straight and

bent knees. When you are going up the boat ramp, pause at the bottom with your heels on the ramp and lean forward for another way to stretch your calves. Anytime you are sitting, stretch one leg at a time out in front of you with your heel on the ground, your knee straight, and pull you toes upward to stretch your hamstrings. To stretch the front of your hips and thighs, you can place your foot of one leg on a small chair, or stool, even a couple steps up on the stairs while still standing on the other. Keeping your back straight lean forward to feel the stretch on your standing leg. When you lay down at night, stretch your arms up high overhead and your legs downward for a full body stretch. You can then place your feet together and drop your knees out to the side in a butterfly stretch for your inner thighs.

Adding a few minutes of slowing down to stretch and breathe will make your body and mind feel better.

Vista's Rare Plant Nursery. Bromeliads can be grown with succulents as they don't require a lot of water. An ideal soil mix is 1/3 potting soil, 1/3 bark, and 1/3 Perlite. Huntington Beach is an ideal spot for these plants because of the moist air. Tillandsias or air plants are part of this family. Meetings of Saddleback Valley Bromeliad Society are on the first Thursday of the month at 7:00 p.m. @ Norman Murray Center in Mission Viejo. 
