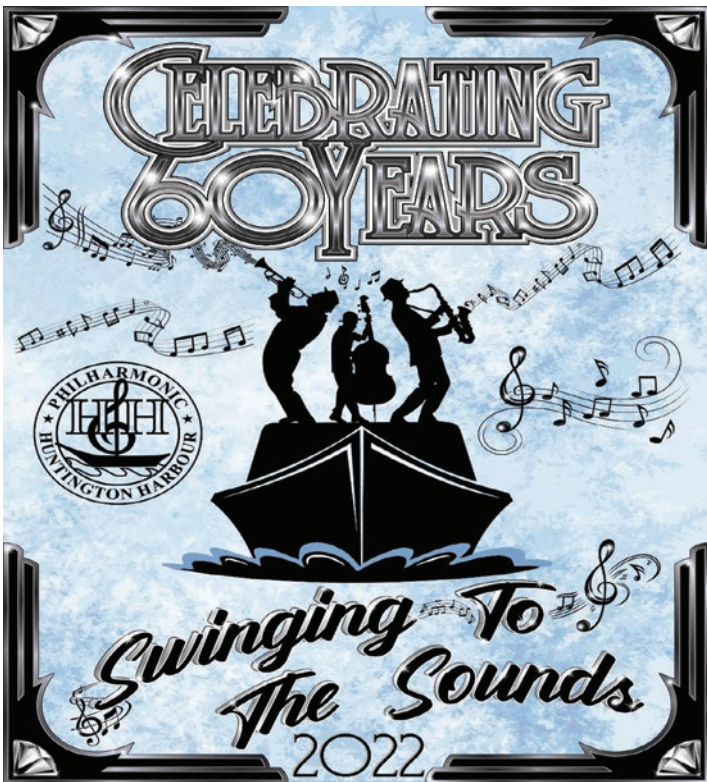

Kielbasa with Apples & Onions

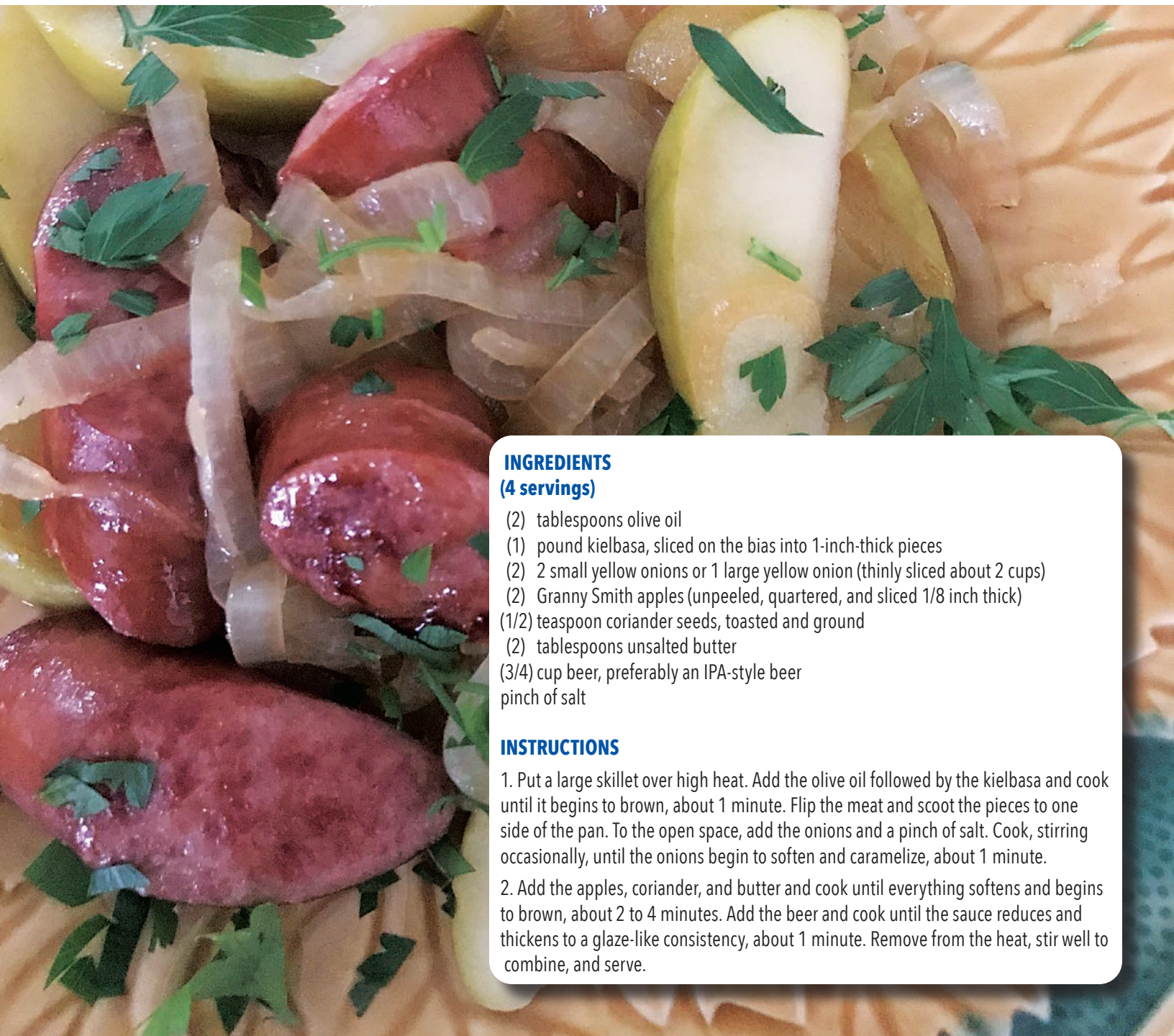
I like to keep some kielbasa sausage in the freezer. It's on reserve for an emergency, easy-to-prepare meal. Often, I braise it with cabbage, potatoes, onions, and broth.

Chef Michael Symon, restaurateur, television personality, and author of "5 in 5 for Every Season" (Clarkson Potter, \$19.99), teams the tasty

sausage with Granny Smith apples, onions, and ground coriander seeds; beer adds the needed tasty liquid to the mix.

The tart apples bring out the best in the meaty sausage. Symon likes to accompany the dish with homemade spaetzle. I settle for rice or orzo and dinner is on the table.

Cathy Thomas is an award-winning food writer and has authored three cookbooks: "50 Best Plants on the Planet," "Melissa's Great Book of Produce," and "Melissa's Everyday Cooking with Organic Produce." For more than 30 years, she has written about cooking, chefs, and food trends for newspapers. She was the first newspaper food journalist to pioneer taping how-to culinary videos for the web. INGREDIENTS (4 servings)

- (2) tablespoons olive oil
- (1) pound kielbasa, sliced on the bias into 1-inch-thick pieces
- (2) 2 small yellow onions or 1 large yellow onion (thinly sliced about 2 cups)
- (2) Granny Smith apples (unpeeled, quartered, and sliced 1/8 inch thick)
- (1/2) teaspoon coriander seeds, toasted and ground
- (2) tablespoons unsalted butter
- (3/4) cup beer, preferably an IPA-style beer
- pinch of salt

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Put a large skillet over high heat. Add the olive oil followed by the kielbasa and cook until it begins to brown, about 1 minute. Flip the meat and scoot the pieces to one side of the pan. To the open space, add the onions and a pinch of salt. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the onions begin to soften and caramelize, about 1 minute.
2. Add the apples, coriander, and butter and cook until everything softens and begins to brown, about 2 to 4 minutes. Add the beer and cook until the sauce reduces and thickens to a glaze-like consistency, about 1 minute. Remove from the heat, stir well to combine, and serve.

“Scholars’ Hope” Sets Students on the Right Path

When a local educator launched what was then known as “El Viento” in 1997, students from the Oak View area of Huntington Beach were dropping out of school at an alarming rate and generally not doing well in life.

Now, 25 years later, hundreds of students have benefitted from the tutoring, counseling and life skills help they received through the program now called “Scholars’ Hope.” And once they graduate from high school, the Assistance League® of Huntington Beach is there to give them another leg up with scholarships for their first two years in college.

Just this year the Assistance League Scholars’ Hope committee gave \$37,000 to 12 students who graduated from high school and are attending a variety of two-year and four-year colleges. What started out as a goal to get students to attend community colleges, now sees students at such four-year schools as Johns Hopkins, UCLA, UC Berkeley, and UC Riverside.

Students attending four-year schools receive as much as \$5,000 and those choosing Golden West College or Orange Coast College can receive \$2,000. The students are required to write an essay before their first and second years of college to earn the scholarships after their participation in the program.

The Scholars’ Hope Foundation started as an effort to improve the lives of 200 high risk students from Huntington Beach’s Oak View neighborhood. Originally designed for fifth grade teachers to choose students with potential but difficult life challenges to participate in the after school enrichment program, it has now developed into both an online and in-person resource with accredited teachers and counselors offering tutoring,

life coaching and overall support.

Organizers said the program lost students during the pandemic so it has now been expanded to include all areas in Huntington Beach and Westminster and it can be teachers or parents who request a student’s participation in the program. Both parents and students are required to give a 100 percent commitment to the program. There are currently about 100 students in the program, which has just re-opened a designated classroom at Ocean View High School where they can receive academic support as well as social support and life services. Students also meet one-on-one twice a month with a counselor either online or in person.

The program has been such a success that every student participating graduates from high school and many with a 3.5 GPA or better. Parents are also able to take advantage of the counseling and support services offered through the program.

Huntington Beach City Council hopeful Oscar Rodriguez is an alum of the program and football great Tony Gonzalez is a longtime donor.

For their part, in addition to doing well in school and in life, students volunteer at the Assistance League thrift shop during

their vacations, including Thanksgiving, Christmas and Spring Break. They really enjoy working in the shop and say it helps them develop retail skills and an understanding of volunteering.

Short-Term Nonsense, Short-Term Noise

Most of us would probably regard the most recent corporate earnings report as bad news: earnings in aggregate were below expectations, and nearly a quarter of companies missed the estimates that they, themselves, were largely responsible for signaling. Last May, third quarter earnings for companies in the S&P 500 were forecast to rise by 9.7%. The most recent expected gain was reduced to 2.5%.

So that should mean that stock prices went down, right? Actually, the stock market responded with a significant rally last month (the best October since 1976, no less!), which offers an important lesson about the news that most of us consume from the financial press. The lesson is that all those the corporate earnings announcements, shifts in interest rates, inflation and jobs data are terrible predictors of short-term market performance.

Come again? All of this financial data offers us clues to the long-term health of the economy, of corporations overall, of individual corporations, and whether we are likely to stay employed and earn a higher income in the future. Good news is good for the long-term value of stocks; bad news means that companies are growing more valuable at a slower rate than they were before.

But in the short term, there is a much more powerful influence over the behavior of the market—something that investment experts variously call “market sentiment,” or “animal spirits.” These are market-speak for: “We don’t know what the short-

term traders are thinking at any given moment, or how they are going to digest the data that they, like us, are seeing on the screen.” Whatever they’re thinking and feeling, however they are interpreting the data, may or may not be related, in any logical way, to the data itself.

If the community of short-term quick-twitch traders see higher earnings reports, they might think that this is an ideal time to sell and collect their profits. Or they might conclude that it’s time to get on the roller coaster on the way up. They are all watching each other and reacting to what they see others doing. This herd mentality is not in any way predictable from whatever news is coming out. So much nonsense, so much noise...

The most productive way to invest for the long term is to turn off the news and stop doing what is really difficult for all of us: trying to figure out what today’s news means for tomorrow’s (or next week’s) markets. Much better to focus on the things we can control and on living our best life. We’re happy to chat if you’d like to explore either!

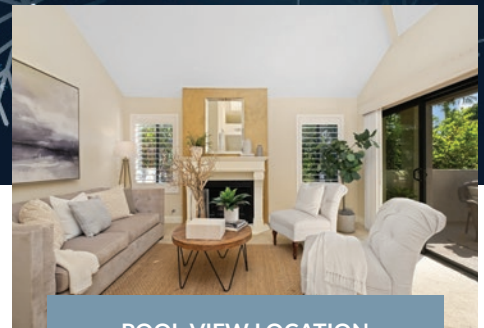
