

Bolsa Chica Conservancy

The Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve is home to over 250 different bird species regularly observed and recorded. Knowing this, it can sometimes be confusing when identifying some of the more visually similar birds in and around Bolsa Chica. Did you know that cranes are not seen in Bolsa Chica, and the bird that you saw with a long neck and pointed beak is most likely a heron or egret?

Egrets and herons are general names that do not necessarily indicate genetic similarities. The Great Blue Heron (Ardea herodias) and the Great Egret (Ardea alba) are more closely related to each other than the Great Egret and the Snowy Egret (Egretta thula). What primarily differentiates if a heron is called an egret is usually color. Herons that are primarily white are typically referred to as egrets, while darker species are called herons. This can get confusing sometimes, as some herons have different color morphs depending on where they are in the country or life stage!

The Great Blue Heron is the largest heron in North America, standing at about 4.5 feet tall with a wingspan of approximately 6.5 feet wide. It is characterized by its primarily cool gray body and bold, black stripe over its eyes, no other heron in Bolsa Chica compares.

The Great Egret is the second tallest member of the Ardeidae family here at Bolsa Chica. Standing at about 3.5 feet in height, this brilliantly white bird has a bright yellow bill and long black legs and feet. During the breeding season the skin around its eyes and bill turn a lime green. Truly spectacular!

The Snowy Egret is the smallest egret in Bolsa Chica, standing at approximately 2 feet tall. Like the Great Egret, the Snowy Egret is known for its pure white feathers. However, unlike the Great Egret, the Snowy Egret has a black bill and black legs with yellow feet. If you're looking at a purely white bird at Bolsa Chica, make sure to look for other identifying characteristics like the beak and the leg colors.

Bolsa Chica is home to 4 other species of herons and egrets. Next time you visit Bolsa Chica, keep an eye out for uncommon sights like the Reddish Egret (Egretta rufescens), the Green Heron (Butorides virescens), the Black-crowned Night-Heron (Nycticorax nycticorax), and the Yellow-crowned Night-Heron (Nyctanassa violacea). We look forward to seeing you out on the trails with us!

Look for the sponsors, donors, volunteers, boat and home decorating contest winners listed in this magazine. The boat parade is an entirely volunteer effort that relies on the support of this community to happen each year and your help is greatly appreciated.

Our Tamale Fundraiser in December was also a success. We sold over 550

tamales and over 30 Philharmonic members and family enjoyed Sunday night of our fantastic Boat Parade at the Viewing Party. They were treated to a craft beer tasting brewed by our own Admiralty members Gail and Rob Sebring. Wine was donated by Trinidad members Sheree and Mike Novak, and hearty appetizers and pizza were provided by Patty Reilly, who also hosted the event. A fun evening was had by all with \$2,118 raised for youth music programs!

Despite our best efforts, not being able to have our major fundraiser, the Cruise of Lights®, for the second year in a row put a big dent in our fundraising for 2021, which directly impacts how much money we have at the end of the year to reinvest in local school music programs. The reinvestment grants come from a percentage of our fundraising efforts throughout the year. For the 2021 grants we only had about half the funds we typically have available to allocate, just \$9.050. The Reinvestment Committee comprised of the group Parliamentarians and led by HHPC Parliamentarians Maggie VanEck and Barbara Sentell, reviewed the grant applications that were submitted and awarded grants to 16 local schools.

We don't know what 2022 will bring, but stay in touch with us for information on upcoming events. The Huntington Harbour Philharmonic Juniors are planning on having their "Jungle Cruise" Fashion Show at Meadowlark Golf Club on March 27, we expect the Philharmonic Committees of Orange County will once again hold a Ducky Regatta and the Golf Tournament. We are confirming fall dates for our Holiday Boutique at the Huntington Harbour Mall, the Huntington Harbour Boat Parade will be celebrating its 60th year, and we're hopeful the Cruise of Lights® will make a comeback.

4 Ways to Jumpstart Your Financial Plan for Success

Do you ever find yourself over-committing to resolutions in the New Year? We're all guilty of this well-intentioned (yet nearly impossible to stick to!) cycle come January. This year, consider focusing first on these four ways to jumpstart your financial affairs.

Consolidate investment accounts with a single trusted Financial Planner.

Some investors believe in the merit of diversifying investments by way of multiple advisors and institutions. While on the surface this may make sense, in reality, it can lead to some serious issues in your overall plan. For one, it is far more difficult to track your total portfolio allocation when accounts are spread across various places. You may be at risk of a very lopsided exposure to equities or bonds. Moreover, in having several advisors, the left hand surely isn't speaking to the right which can lead to big tax implications from portfolio rebalancing, overexposure in certain asset classes, and a mismatched philosophy on investment approach. All these components can erode the effectiveness of your investment plan and add unnecessary stress in your life.

Diagram your estate plan.

Creating a diagram of how your estate will flow (either through your will or trust) is an easy way to visualize all the moving parts. This exercise may show you weaknesses in your plan (i.e., I didn't realize my daughter would inherit my assets with no asset protection!) and allow you to make the necessary amendments before it is too late. Visually illustrating your estate documents also makes it easier to communicate to your executor and Successor Trustees the roles they will be playing.

Check in on how (and where) beneficiaries are titled.

While it is important to check your beneficiaries to ensure the people you really want to receive your money will, it is also essential to review whether they are structured most optimally; for example, philanthropic individuals who are leaving some of their estate to charity should consider naming those charities in their IRA or 401K account and not from their will or trust. Charities pay no taxes whereas your kids inheriting your IRA will have a future tax burden.

Separately, under the SECURE Act, many beneficiaries of inherited IRAs are now limited to a 10-year stretch...but not all! Certain eligible designated beneficiaries (EDBs) will still benefit from the old rules regarding lifetime stretches on inherited IRA distributions. It is important to understand whether any of your beneficiaries are EDBs and to consult with a financial planner and estate attorney to ensure your loved ones receive IRA assets most optimally.

Re-think your tax game plan.

Lastly, if you own an IRA, are taking required minimum distributions (RMD), and also pay quarterly estimated taxes, you may want to consider withholding taxes from your RMD at year-end in lieu of estimated tax payments. In the eyes of the IRS, withholding taxes from your RMD is just as good as making estimated tax payments. And, by delaying tax payments until year-end, you benefit from keeping more of your cash invested longer throughout the year. To effectively employ this strategy, it is helpful to rely on a trusted financial planner or tax preparer to run an estimated tax projection to ensure your RMD withholding is appropriate.

While these ideas may be simple in theory, they are by no means easy to navigate. Each individual's situation calls for its own assessment on how to thoughtfully incorporate these 4 ideas, so don't forget to seek the guidance of a trusted financial planner before making any major moves in your financial plan!

Re-Visiting Balance in a New Year

As the Holidays pass and all the things we put off "until after the holiday" show up on our calendars balance in our lives can be elusive. I encourage lists in any form to keep things from repeatedly bouncing around in your mind as well as doing what you can step by step. My expertise however, is in the physical stepping part.

A better balanced body is worth any and all the effort you put into it. Day to day activities take less energy when posture and balance are aligned. Mis-steps are corrected more easily and moving quicker when we need to are easier with good balance.

So with that busy schedule I mentioned, how can you work on your body balance effectively with little moves often?

Stand up straight with eyes forward.

Poor posture shifts your center of gravity and makes you less stable. Try standing against a wall with your elbows bent but your arms at your side. Bring your head back to touch the wall while keeping your line of sight straight ahead. Hold this position for 30 seconds. To add strengthening to your shoulder blades, squeeze your shoulders down and back for 10-20 second holds.

Move your arms and your head while walking or standing in line.

This helps your body continue to adjust to changes in position and get better at accommodating movement. Your eyes and inner ears will both benefit from this exercise that doesn't take any extra time.

Switch feet to practice balancing separately on each leg.


We all have habit patterns of shifting weight to one side or the other. It is especially common for parents and grandparents to carry a small child on one hip to keep the other hand free. These patterns often remain throughout our activities, especially standing. The best practice we can do is to stand on one foot at a time and work on our balance any time we think of it. As it gets easier, try with your eyes closed but in the beginning you may need hand support on a wall or counter. I have added this to my daily routine when I brush my teeth, 2 minutes, right?! As you get better and better at your single leg balance which you will if you practice, add more elements such as bringing your arms overhead or placing your unweighted foot up a bit higher on your standing leg (moving toward yoga tree pose).



For some, balance is a way of life.

Balance is involved in everything we do at any age. It becomes even more important as we age and flexibility changes. Better balance helps prevent falls and injuries which can side line us.

If you need help setting up a program specifically for you and challenges you may be experiencing, please reach out to your Physical Therapist. They are experts in movement.

Think you don't like kale? I bet you would be fond of it cooked with garlic and accented with lemon juice. And then, turned into kale-topped toasts adorned with sunny-side up eggs. If you prefer firmer yolks, turn the eggs to cook on both sides, or substitute moist scrambled eggs or scrambled egg whites.

Look for kale with a fresh scent that is crisp, without wilting or discoloration. I prefer Tuscan kale, the more-tender variety that has puckered leaves that are such a deep green color they can almost look black. Rinse in tub of cold water, gently swishing the leaves around to remove any dirt.


Toasts With Kale, Parmesan And Sunny-Side Eggs (4 servings)

- 4 (3/8-inch thick) slices rustic bread, 1 1/2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil (divided use), 5 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese (divided use), 1 large garlic clove, minced, 6 cups Tuscan kale or curly-edge kale (that has been washed, patted dry, midrib removed, loosely packed, cut into 1/4-inch wide crosswise slices), 1/4 cup water, 1 1/2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice, 4 eggs, seasoned salt, such as Spike or Lawry's, optional: hot sauce to taste
- 1. Adjust oven rack to 8 inches below broiler element. Turn on oven light and broiler. Place bread in single layer on rimmed baking sheet. Broil until just lightly browned, about 30 seconds. Remove from oven, turn bread over and lightly brush with olive oil, using about 1/2 tablespoon. Sprinkle each toast with 1 tablespoon cheese. Return to broiler. Keep a close eye on the toast; broil until lightly browned, about 40 to 50 seconds.
- 2. Line a large plate with paper towels. Heat remaining oil in large, deep skillet on medium-high heat. Add garlic, kale, and water, and then season with salt and pepper. When liquid comes to a boil, cover and cook until tender, about 5 to 8 minutes, tossing mixture 2 or 3 times during cooking (curly-edged kale will take longer to cook than Tuscan kale). Remove lid and cook until most of liquid evaporates, about 1 minute. Add lemon juice and toss. Place on paper-towel lined plate.
- 3. Place toasts on 4 plates. Generously spray a medium-size nonstick skillet with cooking spray. Place on medium-high heat. When hot, add eggs one at a time,



placing them in a single layer. Reduce heat to low. Cook until white is set, about 2 minutes. Divide kale between 4 toasts. Using a spatula, remove each egg from skillet and place on top of kale. Sprinkle eggs with seasoned salt and remaining cheese. If desired, sprinkle on a little hot sauce. Serve immediately. Source: "50 Best Plants on the Planet" by Cathy Thomas (Chronicle, \$29.95)
