




### **HHPC: Islanders**




### Kielbasa with Apples & Onions

Something like a custardy baked pancake, clafouti is a French dessert or breakfast treat that showcases fruit that is covered with a thick flan-like batter. Often dusted with powdered sugar, it's served lukewarm or within 6 hours keeping it at room temperature. I like to serve it with sweetened whipped cream or whipped crème fraiche. Leftovers, stored in the fridge, make a great breakfast treat, topped with sweetened yogurt and additional berries. In this rendition, fresh raspberries are the star.

### RASPBERRY CLAFOUTI (6 SERVINGS) INGREDIENTS

Soft butter for greasing baking dish

- (3) cups fresh raspberries
- (1/2) cup plus 1 tablespoon granulated sugar (divided use)
- (1/2) cup whole milk (see cook's notes)
- (1/2) cup crème fraiche
- (4) large eggs
- (1/3) cup all-purpose flour

Pinch of salt, Powdered sugar, as a dessert sweetened whipped cream or whipped crème fraiche.

#### **COOK'S NOTES**

Generally, I don't have whole milk on hand, but I often have a container of heavy cream. So, I mix a little of that cream into my 2 percent fat milk.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Adjust oven rack to middle position. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Butter a 9-inch ceramic baking dish, or a 2-quart gratin dish, or a 9-inch cake pan.
- 2. In medium bowl, gently toss raspberries with 1 tablespoon sugar; set aside while preparing the remaining ingredients.
- 3. In food processor or blender, combine 1/2 cup sugar, milk, crème fraiche, eggs and salt. Process to combine. Add flour and pulse just to combine.
- 4. Arrange berries in prepared baking dish, then scrape egg mixture over them. Bake until "cake" is golden and center springs back when lightly touched, about 35 minutes. Cool and dust with powdered sugar. Adapted from "Dinner in French" by Melissa Clark.

### The Second Act: SECURE 2.0

We all experience that year-end push to tie up loose ends, and the President is no exception. On December 29, 2022, President Biden signed into law the SECURE 2.0 Act. As with the original SECURE Act, 2.0 aims to reform how Americans prepare for retirement by Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement. Below we've highlighted a few key provisions on how the government plans to deliver on this acronym.

#### Key provisions taking effect in 2023:

- ✓ If you were born between 1951-1959, you can now wait until age 73 to take Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from your tax-deferred retirement account. If you were born after that, the RMD age is now 75.
- ✓ If you fail to take an RMD, the penalty is reduced from 50% of the distribution amount to 25%. Also, the penalty may be further reduced to 10% if you fix the error within a prescribed correction window.
- ✓ Roth versions of SEP and SIMPLE IRAs are now allowed.
- ✓ Employers may now make contributions to traditional and Roth employer sponsored retirement accounts.
- ✓ Families can establish SEP IRA plans for their household employees, such as nannies or housekeepers.
- ✓ Among other benefits, small businesses can take retirement plan start-up credits to offset up to 100% of their plan start-up costs (increased from a 50% cap).

#### Key provisions taking effect in 2024:

✓ The RMD requirement for employer-sponsored Roth accounts, such as Roth 401(k)s and Roth 403(b)s has been removed to align with treatment of Roth IRAs.

- ✓ If you are a widow or widower inheriting your spouse's retirement plan assets, you will be able to elect to determine your RMD date as if you were your spouse, which is helpful if the decedent is significantly younger.
- ✓ If you're paying off student debt and trying to save for retirement, student loan payments will qualify as elective deferrals in a company retirement plan. This means whether you contribute to your company retirement plan or you make student loan payments, your employer can use either amount as a base for their matching contributions.
- ✓ Families may be able to transfer up to \$35,000 of 529 college saving plan assets into a Roth IRA for the beneficiary. Note that this provision includes several hurdles to qualify, so it is important to rely on the advice of a planner before making any moves.

SECURE 2.0 Act is 358 pages in length, so this list is far from exhaustive; it includes other provisions ranging from increases in 401(k), 403(b) and SIMPLE plan catch-up contribution limits, to expanded Saver's Credits for low-income savers, and an accelerated plan participation window for part-time workers. It is important to note that additional provisions also take effect between 2025 and 2027.

### The Goodwin Company Celebrates Over 100 Years in Operation







The Goodwin Family, long-time Huntington Harbour residents, celebrated the 100 year anniversary of their chemical contract manufacturing company in 2022.

The Goodwin Ammonia Company was founded in 1922 by Thomas Arthur Goodwin and his son, Maurice Goodwin. The company manufactured and sold household chemical products in the Los Angeles area under the "Goodwin" brand name. Goodwin's Magic Cloud Ammonia was their most popular product and was the focus of the business until Don G. Goodwin, Maurice's son, secured a contract manufacturing agreement for a product line named "Swipe" in 1964.

The business continued to grow under Don G. Goodwin's leadership throughout the 1960's and 70's, and in 1973 they relocated all operations to a new 47,000 square foot facility in Garden Grove, California.

Goodwin branded sales were strong and continued to grow; however, a shift to full time contract manufacturing occurred due to the success of contracts with Armor All and Simple Green during the 1980's. Don's sons, Gary and Tom spearheaded the effort to expand its operations to the east coast, and opened a new facility in Lawrenceville, Georgia in 1986. The company was operating out of 306,000 square feet, and had nearly 300 employees by the time Don G. Goodwin retired in 1996. Tom Goodwin became President and continues the expansion of product lines and facility growth resulting in new facilities for the production of Anti-Freeze and Diesel Exhaust Fluid (DEF).

Goodwin Company celebrated its 100 year anniversary in October 2022. The company remains family owned and operated with Tom's son, Don T. Goodwin now in the role of President. Goodwin Company maintains multiple ISO certified manufacturing and distribution locations in California and Georgia and continues to focus on liquid chemical blending and filling for the household, industrial, and automotive markets.



will be the work of HHAA members and will feature painting, mixed media and photography, as well as quilting and other fiber arts.



### 6 Seconds!

That's how long it takes to embrace a deep breath! Our lives so often run at a fast pace and our nervous system moves into a shallow breathing pattern. This is a protective response as our sympathetic nervous system prepares to fight or flee. It is not a place we are meant to stay in long. Even as we slow down this breath pattern may remain a habit. You cannot fight or flee when you are taking a deep breath. The deep breathing pattern disengages the sympathetic response and allows your body to physiologically ease tension.

Start with just a deep breath any way you can and slow down your exhale to get carbon dioxide out. Move toward a count of 2 inhale and a count of 4 exhale. If you can do this, you are changing your system. Slowly practice until you can extend both. There are many guided breath training and relaxation programs available, find one you like if you need it. I personally like the CALM app.

As you can get a deep breath, look at your abdominal area and learn to breathe diaphragmatically like a baby. I like to share the imagery of a jellyfish as the bell expands and contracts.

That's all, 6 seconds!
