The swordfish just over 273 lbs.. It was caught off of Catalina Island.

Recently I had the honor to weight in a big Swordfish for Angler Leo Cassini, store manager at Melton Tackle in Anaheim. He was fishing Solo from a 24-foot Thresher center console "Ruby", when he hooked the big swordfish. The fish was so big that Leo had to call in a friend, who was fishing in the area, to assist him with the gaffing and hauling the fish into the boat.

The owners of the boat, Jim and Lorie Buchannon, met us at the dock at the Huntington Harbour Yacht Club and we began the process of hoisting the fish out of his boat using the crane. The fish weighed 273 pounds, 3 ounces after gill and bleeding. Leo was deep drop fishing on the front side of Catalina in 900 ft. of water. The line used was 80 lb. test mono.

Our club, The Harbour Rod & Reel Club, maintains a IFGA Certified weigh station to give all angler the opportunity to have their catches weighed and recorded for possible competitions and world record considerations.

Jim and Julie Buchannon are members of the Huntington Harbour Rod & Reel Club, a family oriented competitive fishing club. The club promotes competitive fishing events, educational seminars, annual awards and perpetual trophies. The club also promotes conservation through The Coastal Conservation Agency of California and other local agencies. The club also sponsors an annual fishing trip for at-risk inner-city children.

Our Meetings are held the third Thursday of every month at the Huntington Harbour Yacht club beginning at 6:30 PM with dinner and the speaker starting at 7:00 PM. 61st Annual Huntington Harbour Boat Parade

Who loves a parade... WE DO! And what a wonderful parade it was! The 61st Annual Huntington Harbour Boat Parade was another awesomely epic parade, all because of our wonderful Parade Boaters. With our Grand Marshal Weikko Wirta at the helm, we had 60 boats entertaining the spectators, looking incredible and sounding loud with our theme "The Power of Music". Everything went off perfectly and it was a blast!

The Parade is presented by the all-volunteer Huntington Harbour Philharmonic Committee, almost 300 local Harbour members, supporting youth music education programs of the Philharmonic Society of Orange County.

This was a good year for the Kevin and Barbara Patz family; for the past 8 years they have entered their 30-foot, 2-prop, Skipjack, but it broke down and they thought they wouldn't be able to join in the parade this year. Their young daughters pointed out that they still had a little whaler to participate with, and that they did! They took their patriotic Christmas decorations from the big boat and put them on the small 13-foot whaler named "Mini". They won both "Award of Excellence" and \$500 for the 2-day participation "Little Boat" contest raffle.

Another "Award of Excellence" winner and a crowd pleaser was the Marina High School 28-foot Viking boat. This was their fifth year in the Parade with 'no power just oars', helmed by a young freshman crew rowing their hearts out! The dragon's head was made and decorated with rope LED lights that coordinate with the tail; all lights blinked in unison. The shields were light boxes with rope lights surrounding them, and they corresponded with the oar lights; all stunningly beautiful!

Sweepstakes winner was the Huntington Harbour Yacht Club entry, a 58-foot Tiara. "Big Bucks" was covered in warm white

Resolving to Improve Your Financial Health (or, Good vs. Bad Debt)

How are you doing with your New Year resolutions? Along with the usual "lose weight" and "exercise more" variety, many folks resolve to improve their financial health which often includes reducing their debt. However, not all debt is the same so how do you know what is "good" and "bad" debt?

The simple answer is that good debt is borrowing to enhance your future net worth or personal prospects. A home mortgage falls in this category since, over time, home values tend to appreciate (in the meantime you have the roof over your head to keep off the rain!).

Borrowing to pay for higher education might also be considered good debt but with a caveat. If the degree being financed doesn't lead to a job that will generate enough income to pay back the loan (plus interest!), then the education debt moves into the "bad" range.

Almost a third of small businesses fail to survive their first two years, so startup money is more likely than not to eventually fall into the bad debt category. A side note: proceed with caution when investing in startups!

There are numerous examples of bad debt, but the one we can control most is buying luxury items that we don't need. For example, buying an 80-inch TV to replace our 70-inch TV or a very expensive car that

also happens to be a gas guzzler both fall into this bad debt category. If you really want or need those things, it's better to save for them and avoid the interest rate charges. Another (potentially) problematic drain on your financial health are those second homes on the lakefront, desert golf course, or mountaintop that not only put you in debt, but also incur annual maintenance costs. Careful planning prior to this purchase ensures that it's a source of joy and not stress.

How do you know when you have too much debt? The Debt.org website suggests that if your monthly debt payments come to more than 43% of your monthly income, it becomes a red flag to potential lenders. For instance, you may not be able to get a mortgage or car loan if your debt ratio exceeds that amount.

For those that find themselves in this unhappy situation, there are a variety of debt consolidation options that can help people who are deeply in bad debt. However, much like losing weight and exercising more, these strategies require discipline. They only work if the would-be consolidator is resolute about paying off the consolidated debt on time each month and can control spending going forward (to not add to the credit card balances they're trying to pay off).

Whatever your New Year resolutions, it always helps to have a plan to reach them and if your resolutions includes improving your financial health, be sure your plan includes the debt side of your balance sheet (good and bad!), too.

Often audiences aren't familiar with the organization and the fashion shows are a good way to spread the word about donating to the thrift shop, shopping in the thrift shop, or becoming a member of ALHB.

Everything worn by the models on fashion show day is for sale and often committee members bring similar items from the thrift shop to sell at events. Audiences are astonished at the items available in the thrift shop, and the shows generally bring in between \$500 to \$1,000 each, plus good PR.

In January a local art association rented the upstairs meeting room for a fashion show, and the audience will be able to shop downstairs after the show.




