




members to come out to shop and volunteer time at the boutique.

Don't Get Hurt Returning to Exercise

If you haven't been moving around much, take some simple steps when returning to exercise this summer.

Things look quite a bit different this summer. Many people are looking to get active and enjoy the warm weather. This is especially noticeable as we passed the 4th of July and are fully into boating season. But if you had a long break from activity, your body won't be ready to jump right back in. Here are a few tips to help you get more active without getting hurt:

Start slow

- •Whatever your activity of choice is, start with short periods of activity and gradually work your way back up.
- •Think about a walking program, maybe swimming, or cycling
- •If you are resuming a weight program, start with lighter weights and less reps.

Warm Up and Cool Down

A good warm up gets your heart and lungs ramped up and prepares your muscles and tendons for the increase in activity about to come. Include some light cardio, followed by stretching.

Cooling down transitions your body back to a lower state of stress - it brings your heart rate and breathing down, decreases blood flow to your muscles and back to places like your digestive system, and helps you relax. It's also a great place for more stretches.

Take a Day Off

Rest days let your body recover and keep you from getting burned out. Not enough exercise isn't good for you, but too much of a good thing can cause problems too.

Watch for Early Signs of Injury

Some soreness for a few days after activity is normal, especially if you've had a long break. But there are a few common issues to watch out for as you return to activity:

- •Swelling or bruising
- •Joint pain, especially in the knees or shoulders
- •Foot pain, which could be a sign of plantar fasciitis, ankle sprains
- •Muscle strains these are particularly common in the hamstrings

Any of these issues justifies a call to your physical therapist. Getting checked out early can prevent an injury that derails your attempt to return to activity. PTs see all of the issues above on a regular basis and can help safely guide you back into a more active lifestyle.

Estate Planning "Friction"

When we do estate planning, generally we are looking at how to efficiently pass asset to heirs - children, grandchildren, and oftentimes charities. The goal is to reduce 'friction', or costs, which come in the forms of estate taxes, future income taxes, and damaged family relationships.

Estate Taxes - currently the lifetime gift and estate exemption is \$12 million per person, or \$24 million per couple. However, it drops down to \$6 million after 2025. Real estate alone in Southern California can eat up a big chunk of that exemption. Most, if not all, people with large estates seek methods of reducing or avoiding estate taxes in order to maximize wealth transferred to lower generations.

Ways to decrease one's taxable estate include annual gift tax exclusions (in 2022 you can give up to \$16,000 to any individual gift-tax free), paying college and medical expenses of your heirs, generation skipping trusts, and doing a Roth Conversion (the taxes you pay decrease your estate).

Future Income Taxes – an estate may be below the estate taxable threshold (discussed above), but future income taxes may be a reality. Inherited IRA and 401K accounts avoided income taxes during the owner's life and continue to defer taxes when inherited by a spouse. When a non-spouse (children, grandchildren, sometimes other family and friends) inherits those accounts, future distributions will be taxable income. Further, a non-spouse has 10 years to fully distribute those tax-deferred accounts. Large IRAs could cause large tax problems.

Two ways to mitigate future income taxes: (1) Roth conversions if you are likely in a lower tax bracket than your heirs; and (2) including charities as IRA beneficiaries. If you have IRA and non-IRA assets, and you are giving

amounts to charity, you should maximize non-IRA assets to heirs and IRA assets to charities, who pay no taxes on the IRA distribution.

Damaged Family Relationships - this might be the most tragic. Usually, it revolves around communication. The older generation is often reticent to communicate their estate plan to younger generations. Understandably, one doesn't want to tell children about how much money they have if they expect "the kids" to pester them for gifts or loans (that might not get repaid). However, they can discuss the plan without dollar amounts. If the estate is not divided equally among children, it might be good to inform the heirs and provide the reason.

Another issue comes when one of the children is made executor or successor trustee. If there are three children, you may be putting the child acting as your agent in a difficult position. Being a trustee is generally a thankless job. Beneficiaries always want more money and faster movement of the money into their pockets. Trustees don't want to prematurely deplete an estate/trust because if later claims come, it is the trustee's personal liability ... and trying to reclaim money that was previously distributed can cause problems. These situations are asking for sibling discord. Parents should take every effort to let siblings be siblings and avoid situations that can permanently disrupt family relationship.

Baked Apples with Cranberries, Nuts & Brown Sugar

How 'bout some beautiful baked apples from the slow cooker? Oh, they fill the house with tempting apple aroma. They are one of my favorite breakfast treats, but with a little whipped cream or ice cream, they can be scrumptious desserts. As a finale, I like to pass crisp cookies for some luscious texture contrast.

Use a melon baller to take out the core, about 3/4 of the way down, the bottom portion still intact. Dig in and turn the handle – don't be shy!

Mix brown sugar, cinnamon, and dried fruit – cranberries, cherries, or raisins and apricots. Spoon it into the cavities and they go into the slow cooker along with 1/2 cup apple juice.

Cover and cook on slow setting for 4 hours. INGREDIENTS (Yield: 4 breakfast servings, or 8 halves for dessert)

(1/4) cup butter

- (1/2) cup coarsely chopped pecans
- (1/2) cup dried cranberries, or dried cherries, or chopped dried apricots (or a
- combination of all three),
- (1/2) cup (packed) light brown sugar
- (3/4) teaspoon ground cinnamon
- (4) medium Granny Smith apples (cored, see cook's notes)

(1/2) cup apple juice

For serving: cream, or half and half, or yogurt for breakfast approach, whipped cream or ice cream for dessert.

COOK'S NOTES

An apple corer is a device that has a handle with a circular cutting device at the end. When pushed through the apple, it is rotated to remove the core to the diameter of the circular cutting device. Only cut 3/4 of the way down, leaving the bottom portion intact.




