
Pan-Braised Chicken with Dried Fruit

In a long-ago issue of Bon Appetit magazine, the writer acknowledged that this easy Pan-Braised Chicken with Dried Fruit recipe was inspired by the Chicken Marbella formula in "The Silver Palate Cookbook" (by Julee Rosso and Sheila Lukins, Workman, 1979). The original Marbella was so popular, it became the go-to 80's dinner party entrée for home cooks from coast to coast.

Chicken Marbella required overnight marination in the fridge. Plus, it called for a long list of ingredients, everything from quartered chickens to prunes to pitted green olives, plus hearty amounts of white wine and brown sugar. This riff on the original has a much shorter number of ingredients and I like it better.

OLIVES (YIELD: 3 SERVINGS)

Ingredients

- (3) skinless boneless chicken breasts
- (1) teaspoon ground cumin Salt and pepper to taste
- (2) tablespoons olive oil
- (2) garlic cloves (finely chopped)
- (3/4) cup mixed dried fruit (about 3 oz.) such a combination of golden raisins, dried cherries, dried apricots (halved or quartered if large), or dried figs (halved or quartered if large).
- (1/2) cup dry white wine,
- (2/3) cup canned low sodium chicken broth
- (8) brine cured pitted green olives

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Sprinkle chicken on all sides with cumin, salt and pepper. Heat oil in deep large skillet over medium heat. Add chicken and sauté until brown, about 3 minutes per side. Push chicken to side of skillet. Add garlic to skillet; cook, stirring, about 30 seconds. Add dried fruits, wine, broth and olives and bring to boil. Push chicken back into place (rather than just on the side).
- 2. Simmer chicken uncovered until just cooked through, turning chicken occasionally with tongs, about 10 to 13 minutes. Test chicken to make sure it is cooked through, cutting the thickest portion to expose interior.
- 3. Transfer chicken to plates. Increase heat and boil until sauce is slightly thickened, about 4 minutes. Spoon sauce over chicken and serve.

Giving a helping hand

A young Army veteran with an 11-year-old son found herself homeless and hungry after fleeing an abusive relationship. She had no place to go, no food, no clothing and was getting close to having no hope.

She found herself in the Veterans Resource Center (VRC) at Golden West College. There, staff members got busy helping – the two were fed, given gas and grocery gift cards, a laptop, toiletries, shoes, food and snacks from the center's pantry.

Staff members also contacted six governmental agencies about the case and the VRC expected to have hotel vouchers for the two within a day and an appointment for a HUD housing appointment soon.

According to VRC staff members, the veteran was grateful and cried when she left the center, saying it would help change her life. And much of that help came from the Assistance League of Huntington Beach, which, through its veterans programs, keeps the VRCs at Golden West College and Coastline College stocked with food and gift cards for food and gas for veterans in need.

Last year alone, ALHB gave \$1,500 in gas and \$1,500 in grocery cards to the centers. The Chapter also gives specially requested items to the centers, such as an air fryer, a five-gallon water dispenser and a Keurig coffee maker.


In addition to donating items to help veterans through their immediate needs, ALHB also gives scholarships to vets. Through Golden West College's police training program known as the Regional Justice Training Center, ALHB has been giving scholarships to cadets going through the training since 2014. Since then, more than \$300,000 in scholarships has been awarded through the program.

Additionally, scholarships are awarded to vets at Coastline College at the end of every spring semester. Last year \$37,600 went to the college's veterans in an effort to help them maintain housing and basic needs.

Last year ALHB expanded its work with vets by contracting with Coastline College so needy veterans can get help through the Chapter's Operation New Beginnings. Coastline's Veterans Resource Center director can refer veterans to the ALHB program where they will receive a voucher and can come in and pick up clothes, home goods or other items they may need.

Funds for the veterans programs come from the Chapter, and DreamCatchers also donate for the Regional Justice Training Center scholarships. Last year \$52,000 was given in scholarships to veterans in three classes training with the program,

Assistance League Huntington Beach often receives notes of thanks from veterans served through its programs, but members working with the vets say they are the ones who feel gratitude – in knowing they are helping change someone's life and in giving back to veterans who have given so much to the country.

Time to Take Out the Trash!

You may have noticed that the rains this year have washed a record amount of trash into the Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve. The majority of the trash that you see gets washed down through the Wintersburg Flood Control Channel which bisects the Reserve. The urban runoff from multiple cities brings trash and debris of all shapes and sizes into Outer Bolsa Bay. From furniture to golf balls, much is easily recognizable as the trash that somehow missed the garbage bin. Other types of garbage; micro plastics, Styrofoam, and hypodermic needles are of greater concern as they present even more of a challenge to

remove from the environment.

As the tides rise and fall the trash starts to work its way either out of the Reserve, into the harbor headed to the ocean and beaches, or it gets pushed deeper into the layers of plants and mud at the edges of the wetland bays. These edges are critical nesting habitats for many bird species, including the endangered Belding's Savannah Sparrow.

The thought of these small birds nesting amongst the trash is heartbreaking, and every year the Bolsa Chica Land Trust dedicates numerous community volunteer events to removing mountains of trash. However, our window of time to orchestrate trash removal is short. During nesting season which stretches roughly from March 15th to September 1st of each year, no one is permitted to go into the areas where most of the trash accumulates, so as to not disturb the nesting birds. Now, as we are out of nesting season, you may see our teams by the waters edge diligently picking the garbage out of the wetlands by hand.

Although many who help in the efforts to clean the trash from the wetlands volunteer their time, the Land Trust still has significant staffing and equipment costs with each workday. Please help us keep our waters, sensitive nesting sites, and coastal environment clean! Consider making a donation or register to lend a hand at one of our workdays. 
Seek professional observation and guidance to see the new big picture.
